Observation: During the site visit, several unit files were missing the copies of the applicant screenings and the Health and Safety form (units affected 15, 24, 29, 36, 52, 58, 61, 66, 68, 74, 81, 85, 93 and 106). All of the items were submitted prior to the issuance of this report, therefore no findings were issued. It appears that the issues stem from not properly filing tenant documents. If management decides to keep separate files for different program requirement, section off the file into program sections, or submits files to a compliance department for review and approval, management must ensure that each tenant file, sections of the tenant file, or approved compliance file contains all required forms moving forward.

If a new household moves in to any of the units with Findings (listed below), instead of submitting the required Corrective Action documents, submit with your response: the application for tenancy, the verifications, the Income Certification, and the 1<sup>st</sup> page of the lease for the new household occupying the unit.
